Includes Louisiana and Illinois areas.

Mexico, Valley of, and the Federal District, 1899, Spanish, by Miguel Arriago.

Mexico – Atoyac or Atoyac de Alvarez, n.d., Tlaxcala area, post-revolution, color, hand drawn. Includes area surrounding town, landforms, roads, plaza, buildings, and forts.

New England and New France, government and divisions, See New Spain, government chart. North America, from Panama to the Arctic Ocean, See Mexico

North America, by A.K. Johnston, Edinburgh, n.d. (pre-1846). Shows area from Panama to the Arctic Ocean. Includes rivers, landforms, major cities. Shows Oregon Territory, the U.S. - Mexican claims of 1828 along the Arkansas River line, New Mexico, an independent Texas, and Upper and Lower California.

Rome, Map of Rome, n.d, in Old English. Map inscribed to His Grace the Duke of Queensbury and Dover. Showing present and ancient locations of palaces, parishes, oratories, fraternities, etc.
